# Minutes NILES BUCHANAN CASS AREA TRANSPORTATION STUDY TECHNICAL ADVISORY COMMITTEE and POLICY COMMITTEE MEETING Tuesday, May 28, 2024 – 1:30 pm Niles District Library, Niles MI

#### 1. Call to Order and Roll Call

Technical Advisory Committee Chair, Joe Bellina, called the meeting to order at 1:35 pm, and Kim Gallagher conducted roll call.

- 2. <u>Changes to the Agenda</u> None.
- 3. <u>Public Comment</u> None.
- Approval of the minutes from the March 26, 2024 Meeting Motion to approve the minutes from the March 26, 2024, Joint NATS Technical Advisory Committee and Policy Committee Meeting. Made by Jim Sturdevant and seconded by Roseann Marchetti. Motion approved.
- 5. Staff Report

Gallagher gave a presentation about the Michigan Infrastructure Office (MIO) Technical Assistance Center (TAC). The TAC offers support for Grant identification, Grant Writing, and Match assistance. She highlighted the Safet Streets for All grant, a federal program aimed at reducing traffic fatalities and serious injuries. To be awarded funding for safety improvements, agencies will need a safety action plan, which the grant can also fund.

6. Local Agency Updates

**City of Niles – Wayne Street:** Joe Ray said that construction is underway, and milling of the asphalt will begin in two weeks.

Kovnat announced that all FY 2024 NATS projects had been obligated.

7. Transit Updates

Pepper Miller gave an update for Niles Dial A Ride Transit (NDART). They negotiated the annual split of FTA 5307 funds between NDART and Transpo (South Ben transit agency). The total allocation was approximately 15% higher than in 2023. NDART is working on updating routes to better align with Transpo, which will make trips into Indiana much easier.

8. MDOT Updates

#### (see meeting packet page 5-6 for more details)

Concerns were raised about the construction on M-51/US-12, which has resulted in the road being one-way. This has caused a significant increase in traffic on Fort Street and Silverbrook Road, as drivers are using these routes to access 3rd Street, a parallel alternative to M-51. Suggestions included installing temporary stop signs to manage the traffic, though there were warnings that this could lead to significant backups on 3rd Street. The impact on local businesses due to the construction was also discussed.

#### 9. MDOT Amendment

*(see meeting packet page 7 for amendment details)* There were no questions or comments about the proposed amendment.

**Motion** for the Technical Advisory Committee to recommend that the Policy Committee Approve the Amendment to the NATS 2023-2029 Transportation Improvement Program as included in the meeting packet. Made by seconded by Roseann Marchetti and Jim Sturdevant. **Motion passed**.

**Motion** for the Policy Committee to approve the recommendations from the Technical Advisory Committee. Made by Sandra Seanor and seconded by Susan Flowers. **Motion passed**.

#### 10. Discussion of the 2026-2029 Project Prioritization Criteria

Kovnat provided an overview of the changes between the 2023-2026 Project Prioritization Criteria and the draft 2026-2029 Project Prioritization Criteria. The majority of the changes were well received.

There was a suggestion to clarify the safety criteria, which currently states to "use the last five years of crash data". he concern is that the most recent year's data may not yet be available, and the wording could be interpreted to include incomplete data from the current year. It was recommended to change the criteria to "the last five full years for which crash data is available."

There were concerns raised about the pass/fail criteria for addressing water or sewer issues. Much of the area's water and sewer infrastructure is old and in need of repairs. This would require full reconstruction of the roadways, yet the funding is not sufficient to cover this. The question was whether the criteria, as written, would prevent the funding of surface repairs for roads with old water/sewer infrastructure underneath.

# 11. Approval of the FY 2025 Unified Work Program

Gallagher gave an overview of the UWP, highlighting the new items for FY 2025. She added that the SPR funds, with MDOT's match, are pass-through funds designated for MACOG. These funds will be used by MACOG to pay a consultant to update the cross-state travel demand model that includes the NATS area.

**Motion** for the Technical Advisory Committee to recommend that the Policy Committee approve the NATS FY 2025 Unified Work Plan. Made by Jim Sturdevant and seconded by Butch Payton. **Motion passed**.

**Motion** for the Policy Committee to approve the recommendations from the Technical Advisory Committee. Made by Roseann Marchetti and seconded by Sandra Seanor. **Motion passed**.

#### 12. <u>Privilege of the Floor or Public Comment</u> None.

#### 13. Adjournment

The meeting was adjourned at 2:42 PM. Then the next meeting is scheduled for April 23, 2024.

#### Project Category per MDOT's "Guidelines for Geometrics on Local Agency Project" (3 points possible)

3 points: The project follows the MDOT 4R guidelines

2 points: The project follows the MDOT 3R guidelines

1 point: The project follows the MDOT Preventative Maintenance guidelines

# Regional Significance (8 total points possible)

#### Traffic Volume (5 points possible)

# Complete Streets (5 total points possible)

#### Pedestrian and Cycling Facilities (3 Points possible)

1 point: The road currently has pedestrian or bicycle facilities and there is a maintenance plan in place

2 points: The road currently has pedestrians or bicycle facilities and the project will add additional facilities

3 points: The project will add pedestrian or bicycle facilities where none existed previously

#### Improving Non-motorized Connectivity (2 points possible)

2 points: The new pedestrian or bicycle facilities will contribute to regional non-motorized connectivity by connecting to existing pedestrian/bicycle facilities or those expected to be completed before 2029

#### Strategic Planning & Investment (7 total points possible)

Projects can earn one point for meeting each of the following criteria:

- 1 point: The project is listed in a Pavement Asset Management Plan
- 1 point: There is an asset management plan covering other utilities along the limits of the project
- 1 point: The city, Village or Township has adopted an asset management policy

1 point: The project contributes toward achieving a goal identified in another local planning document, such as a master plan or a parks and recreation plan

- 1 point: The project is limits begin or end at a road segment with a PASER of 7 or higher
- 1 point: The agency contributes more than the minimum 18.15% local match
- 1 point: The agency is willing to use an Advance Contract for the project.

# Coordination with sewer and water projects (Pass/Fail)

If there are known water or sewer issues, the project must coordinate utility and road fixes.

# Project Readiness (No Points Pass/Fail)

If the project requires any of the following, each item must be addressed in the application and indicated on the project schedule: utility relocations, ROW acquisition, environmental sensitivity, or Railroad crossings.

# **Cross Jurisdictional Coordination (No Points)**

The project crosses jurisdictional boundaries (i.e. city to township) and it is arranged in such a way to be bid as a single project.
